Celebrations and Recognitions (Watch Video)

District Highlights:

- DeSoto ISD Libraries and district campuses celebrated National Reading Month and Read Across America Week through various student and community engagement activities.
- DeSoto ISD celebrated Women's History Month and National School Counseling Week.

- DeSoto ISD trustees held their Bi-Monthly Town Hall to share information on the upcoming budget process and to gain the community's perspective on the spending focus and priorities.
- DeSoto ISD launched its Metaverse Virtual Reality education program in the Career and Technical Education Health Science Technology pathway to provide students with "hands-on" clinical learning experiences alongside healthcare instructions and medical personnel at any time.
- The DeSoto ISD Fine Arts Department celebrated the Black Excellence: K-12 Art Gala which allowed students to showcase the district's dedicated art programs with the City of DeSoto and the Lonestar Belles of the Society in the community.
- DeSoto ISD held its monthly Career Expo to help bring more teachers, support staff, and volunteers to ensure student growth and academic success.

Student Highlights:

- The DeSoto High School Winterguard won second place in the North Texas Colorguard Association Championships.
- The DeSoto High School Eaglettes Dance team competed in the Crowd Pleaser DFW Dance Competition and won the title of Grand Champion Team.
- Thirteen Ruby Young Personalized STEAM Academy (RYPSA) students received certificates of completion for successfully passing the first courses of instruction in the RYPSA Drone Academy in partnership with the DeSoto Police Department.
- DeSoto High School junior Jailen Boehm was selected for two major academic and career development programs which promote future readiness - the Summer Pre-College Program at Brown University and the Tisch Summer High School Filmmaker's Workshop at NYU.
- Thirteen DeSoto High School choir students earned a superior rating on their UIL Choir Solo and Ensembles and advanced to the UIL State Solo and Ensemble Contest.

- The students of DeSoto High School Wind Symphony were selected as the feature band to perform at the HBCU National Band Directors' Consortium in Atlanta.
- DeSoto High School Band students participated in a recruiting visit with the Texas State University Jazz Band and choir members led by recent DHS graduates and former Eagle band members.
- Six students who earned placement in the SWACDA National Honor choir performed in Little Rock, Arkansas for world-class conductors and college students who worked to recruit them.
- The DeSoto High School Varsity Ladies Treble choir was selected as the SWACDA
 Honors Demonstration Choir and made history as the first all-black choir to have this
 honor. Additionally, the students worked with world-class conductors and received
 additional honors, a certificate for outstanding performance, granted to groups who
 demonstrated excellence during their visit.

Public Session

- Public Comments
 - Two public comments were heard during the meeting on non-agenda items.
- Board Monitoring
 - Board Goals Assessment
 - This monthly progress monitoring session is designed to discuss student and teacher progress in selected areas as it relates to the board's goals. Interim Superintendent Dr. Larry Lewis presented the district data along with potential solutions to meet the progress measures.
 - This monitoring session centered on Board Goal 3: Early Numeracy & Math (GPMs 3.1, 3.2 & 3.3)
 - The District celebrated first and second grade students' success on the NWEA MAP Math Assessment development of early learning students. The students recognized surpassed the recommended 60th percentile and were ranked in the 90th percentile in the nation for students in these grade levels at this

mid-year touchpoint. The selected teachers had the highest number of students who met the required indicators.

- Superintendent Constraint Monitoring- Constraint 1 (GPM: 1.1, 1.2, and 1.3)
 - Interim Superintendent Dr. Larry Lewis presented this agenda item that governs how the superintendent will monitor the educators' impact on individual student growth. Dr. Lewis informed the board that GPM 1.1 is on track and has currently exceeded the mid-year 2022 target while GPM 1.2 and 1.3 are slightly off track.
